STATEMENT OF INTENTION TO SURVEY PUBLIC SCHOOLS NATIONWIDE

Recognising that land is one of the fastest appreciating commodities in Kenya and this epic rush threatens the illegal acquisition of public land;

Noting that while private land-owners may be better equipped with the necessary documents to protect themselves from land-grabbers and encroachment, most public institutions and in particular, our schools, are vulnerable to land-grabbing;

Recalling the 2015 Presidential Directive of H.E. Uhuru Muigai Kenyatta to title all public schools in the country;

Appreciative of the pro-activeness and partnerships emerging at local community levels among the School Administration, Boards of Management and Alumni as well County Governments, Government Ministries, the National Land Commission, the Institute for Surveyors of Kenya, the Shule Yangu Alliance and other private and not for profit actors;

The undersigned hereby announce their intention to collaborate on an accelerated programme of surveying and titling of schools in 2017. The details of the programme

will be worked out in conjunction with County Governments, the Ministry of Education and other stakeholders to ensure that we have a collaborative, swift and effective programme in the coming weeks.

The titling of our public schools is a critical ingredient in the protection and expansion of the right to education for all Kenyans. We shall not fail them or future generations in this regard. We shall keep the public updated on our progress as we seek the participation of all patriotic Kenyans in this matter of public interest.
